

# A joint future binds us Mission Statement

In 1998, Shinshiro City was the first town with the name Newcastle to host a summit of Newcastle towns from around the world. Out of that summit grew our current Newcastles of the World Alliance.

Since 2012, associated Newcastle towns have tried to give more depth to this Alliance. The motivation was to go beyond learning about each other and sharing best practice into an Alliance active in bi- and multi-lateral cooperation projects and youth projects.

Under the guidance of our Newcastles Secretariat (in particular David Faulkner and Zelie Guerin), several initiatives were started and new ways of cooperation explored.

We celebrated the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Alliance in Shinshiro, hoping that this would mark a next step in this development. Unfortunately, the still not completely resolved COVID pandemic and the ongoing War in Ukraine had and still have severe impacts on our daily life. Many Newcastle activities and our conferences had to be cancelled or put on hold as well. However, some activities continued online.

#### The 2023 Conference will celebrate 25 years of the Alliance

When you think of it, this is one amazing fact to be really proud of. During that period, at least five mayoral elections have taken place. Several of the older people who were there in the beginning already have retired, new people have taken over their places. Yet a core of 17 Newcastle communities stayed committed, and many other communities expressed interest and follow us.

When we discussed the future of the Alliance in the coming years, the executive board was clear in its opinion that the Alliance was something special. We definitely should continue and even increase our numbers and activities.

Both COVID and the War in Ukraine stress how important it is that we know about each other, respect and support each other, and cooperate on all levels. The Alliance provides us a unique and non-political platform to build on.

It is our mission that this year we will strengthen our Alliance, not only by meeting once again in person to celebrate, but more important with taking concrete steps in strengthening practical cooperation between our towns. Examples of this are youth exchanges on cultural activities, international school cooperation, traditional craft workshops etc. Some of these activities already exist, like the recent online chess competition, language learning courses, our tourism "passport", photographic exhibitions, and sharing information and best practice through our newsletter.

More ideas about this we will present in the coming months before the summer. We hope others will do the same. In this way, the 2023 Conference should not be just a start for considering options, but a platform for finalizing joint projects and getting others on board as well.

#### **Posters**

Each Newcastle is expected to make at least two, better three posters (size A0 – max 84x118 cm).

The most important poster is your poster on Newcastle cooperation options. How do your town and its schools, universities, civic associations, and individual citizens would like to cooperate with other Newcastles. Does your town or regional authorities provide funding for such cooperation projects? Which projects you offer to run in your Newcastle, people who would like to visit other Newcastles and join projects abroad etc etc.

What about on-line chess competitions between our citizens (not much funds needed). Or annual youth exchanges which a different Newcastle hosting the exchange each year. Maybe your town has a school or university interested in joining or setting up a cooperation network. There are several EU and other non-EU organisations providing grants for that. Another example our Nové Hrady is already active in are craft exchanges, workshops or meetings. WE already organized several for example blacksmith workshops, courses or meetings linked to larger national or international blacksmith meetings.

The other poster(s) is about your Newcastle. Think important social projects or youth activities you would like to show. Where possible, include QR codes so people can easily link or connect to it.

Please remember, most information about your Newcastle is available online already. Also check out our Newcastles website and give us updates and new images. Therefore, it's better to have a very extensive poster on cooperation, and only a small A4 poster with one picture and several QR codes than a very nice poster about your Newcastle, but nothing about cooperation. The best, off course, is covering both.

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#### **Market event**

On Saturday October 14<sup>th</sup>, we will organize a market event on the town square. This will be a larger regional public event. In wooden, roofed market stalls, participating Newcastles can display examples of their local information material (native language and English) and some simple local products. These things are not to give away but as examples to look at.









We will display some of the posters from the conference here as well (for example the town introduction poster). Czech and Slovak students and others fluent in English and Czech will help explaining the displays to the Czech visitors. There also will be a large party tent with tables inside. More details will be given after arrival.

#### Venue

The main Venue is the restored Buquoy Chateau. This 19th century Napoleonic chateau is now the property of the Czech Academy of Sciences and houses the innovative **Academy and University Center of Nové Hrady.** 



The Chateau has excellent facilities including all modern techniques, free internet room, bar, in-house accommodation with internet connections, etc.







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The Entrance Hall has a lot of space for registration and coffee breaks (left). The Theatre Hall (middle and right) doubles as main venue room. It can be used for theatre plays, but once the curtains are opened, there also is a full-size fixed projection screen. High quality projectors and high speed internet allow for hybrid meetings with running presentations and zoom meetings simultaneously.







The circular Blue Room (left) can be used for coffee breaks and poster presentations. The Mirror Room (middle and left) is mostly used for poster sessions, breakout sessions or group working.

#### **Accommodation**

Accommodation will be offered as part of the Conference fee.

Prime accommodation (Luxe) will be available at the Wellness Hotel Rezidence on the Town Square. The hotel offers high quality rooms including access to wellness area and swimming pool and a very extensive continental breakfast.

Standard and budget accommodation is offered in the Venue itself. The rooms are nice and good, but the breakfast is across the street in Hotel May (about 50 meters). Additional budget accommodation with shared facilities is also offered at hotel May.

#### Price packages: accommodation including registration fee

The Conference has **SIX** price packages, luxe, standard or budget in single or double room versions. Fees have to be paid through invoices or simple bank transfers, details of which will be provided after registration.

#### All the price packages include:

- ✓ Registration fee.
- ✓ Selected accommodation from Wednesday afternoon October 11 until Tuesday October 17.
- ✓ Double rooms really have to be occupied with TWO people!
- ✓ Breakfast on all days, details see accommodation packages.
- ✓ Lunch: Thursday October 12 to Tuesday October 17.
- Dinner: Thursday October 12 to Monday October 17.
- ✓ Coffee breaks (coffee, thea, sweets, fruits, waters) during Conference sessions on Tursday, Friday, Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday.
- All cultural events during the conference.

#### Not included in the package:

Drinks during lunches and dinners are NOT included in the price and should be paid by participants individually, unless mentioned differently.

Transport from airport Vienna or Prague to Nové Hrady and return will be facilitated by us but will have to be paid separately by the participants at fixed rates, to be announced soon.

#### Registration

Newcastle municipalities will get a delegation registration form covering all delegates in one form.

## Other general information

#### Which Nové Hrady

Beware: there are TWO towns called Nové Hrady in the Czech Republic.

Our Nové Hrady is in South Bohemia, the other one is 200 km northeast of us, in the Pardubice region.

#### **Conference airport transport**

Please beware: transport from and to airports is **NOT** included in the conference fee.

Depending on the participants travel schedule, one or more full-size busses will pick up participants from Vienna Airport or Prague Airport, In addition, mini-busses and other transport are on standby to pick up participants from other locations. More details will be provided later.

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#### Money

The Czech Republic is part of the European Union and part of the barrier-free Schengen agreement, but is **NOT a EURO country**. The Czech Republic still is using the Czech Koruna (CZK, symbol Kc).

The best thing to do is to **bring your credit card and take money from the ATM machines here in Nové Hrady** (there are two). Changing money in your own country or withdrawing money from airport ATMs is almost always more expensive than withdrawing money in-country at the local ATM.

When using ATMs or paying by credit card, you sometimes get the option "pay in local currency or in your own currency". **ALWAYS use the "local currency" option.** The other option is a rip-off.

#### **Dress Code and weather**

Best described as "casual". We try to keep this as informal and casual as possible. So some people might dress up for the opening ceremony, but it is NOT obligatory. For all events and sessions, whatever people are comfortable in, regardless if jeans or suit and tie; as long as you feel OK in them.

Weather is unpredictable at that time. It can still be nice and mostly dry, but more in line will be around 10-15 degrees Celsius. Take a raincoat and warm sweater to be sure.

#### Market event

On Saturday October 14<sup>th</sup>, we will organize a market event on the town square. This will be a larger regional public event. #### Visa

Participants from some countries need a visa for entering the Czech Republic. Please ask for this in time. If you need a Letter of Invitation, let us know and we will provide one.
